

Gerald Celente: Trump Already Losing the Iran War

Hi everybody, today is Friday, March 20th, 2026, and our dear friend Gerald Celente is here with us. Welcome back, Gerald.

#Gerald

Thank you for having me.

#Nima

Gerald, let me start with something very important—something new. A new war in the Middle East, which we never imagined before Donald Trump came to power. And right now, he's the president of the United States. More than a year into his presidency, the war in Ukraine is still going on, and now he's started a new war in the Middle East. What's your assessment? What's your understanding of the Trump administration so far?

You know, you don't ask why a crazy person is crazy. "Hey, you elect me, I'm going to end that Ukraine war in 24 hours, all right? All right? Hey, now that I'm elected, that Ukraine war is going to end before I get inaugurated, all right? All right?" I was looking for the articles here—I had them someplace—all his quotes about being for peace when he was running for president. One after another. Total BS. He said, "If you elect me, you're going to have peace on Earth. I'm not going to start a war. I'm going to stop wars." One after another. And then go to the cover of the *Trends Journal* last week. Trump said—we attacked Iran because, well, not quote, because I don't want to get sued, but words to the effect—because it was my, this is a true word, "opinion," that they were going to attack first.

Your opinion? I don't care about your opinion. So if I say, you know, that guy across the street—I've been having a fight with this guy—and I thought he was going to attack me, so I killed him. What if I went to court and said that? They'd lock me up in a second. Hey, but I'm the president. It was my opinion. All right? All right. And again, that's who he is. You keep reading the things he's been saying. Yeah, this is from *The New York Times*. The *Times* asked if there were any limitations

on his global powers. They asked Trump, and Mr. Trump said—here's the quote—"Yeah, there is one thing: my own morality, my own mind. It's the only thing that can stop me. I don't need international law." End quote. You don't need international law?

No, hey, don't you know who I am?

Don't you know who I am? Oh yeah, you're some spoiled daddy's boy. I had lunch with his brother Robert back in 2017. He had a restaurant over here across the river. I'm up in Kingston, New York, over in Wassaic. The brother went on—I'm the same age as Trump—and he told me that when their father died back in 2002, he left the family over half a billion dollars' worth of real estate. He's a narcissistic, arrogant guy. You ready? "I don't need international law." Yeah, there's one thing—"my own mind." Your own mind? How about what other people—this guy should be locked up for this. Sending us to war, a violation of the Constitution. "Hey, it's my opinion, my mind. I don't need international law. I don't know who I am." Where's the outrage? Where are the peace movements? Again, I launched Occupy Peace over a decade ago.

Nothing. We're the billionaires—no money for peace. This is dangerous stuff. When you get a guy talking like this and saying these things, a madman's in control by his deeds and his words. "My own mind?" Oh, by the way, he also said—here's the quote—"I have a big ego." You know, I don't know if you know, I used to be a black belt in close combat. Had my own school for many years. Google the name Brad Steiner—he was the top close-combat guy in America. Used to write for my magazine, *The Trends Journal.* The first thing we learned in close combat: the only time your ego comes into play is when your life is on the line. You got it? That's when you have an ego. Hey, I got a big ego. You've got a big egotist running the country, saying these things that nobody else could get away with.

Gerald, it seems that for four years we were talking about how Ukraine was used by the United States as a proxy to defeat Russia. Now it seems the United States is somehow acting as a proxy for Israel in this war. How can people understand that? Because I don't see this kind of attack happening under any president but Donald Trump. They had something going on—after Benjamin Netanyahu came to the United States seven times to talk with Trump, it seems he finally managed to convince them all that this war would be beneficial for both the United States and Israel.

You know, yes and no—in the sense of, would Biden do it? You mean “Genocide Joe”? With his little clown boy, his secretary of state, Antony Blinken? That guy who goes to Israel and says, “I come here as a Jew”? How about coming here as the secretary of state? What the hell do I care what you believe in? Oh, and how about Genocide Joe calling himself a Zionist? So now, going back to Trump—his son-in-law, Jared Kushner, doing negotiations with Iran. Kushner, huh? Google it. When Netanyahu used to come to America, he sometimes stayed at Kushner’s house. That’s right—not Jared’s, his daddy’s. Another spoiled daddy’s boy, Jared Kushner. There’s a clown going out doing negotiations.

What the hell is with this guy? Oh, by the way, he's asking for \$5 billion now for his company, his private equity group. Five billion. He only got \$2 billion from Saudi Arabia. It's a crime syndicate, you got it? And not only Trump—go back to Biden. Hey, remember his son, Hunter? The one who got on the board of directors of Burisma Energy after the United States overthrew the government? A little clown, a coked-out freak on the board of directors of Burisma Energy, a company they just made up after they overthrew the government. Again, it's one after another. But Trump—hey, let's go back to when Trump was president the first time. What, he got \$100 million from Sheldon Adelson?

Hey, get that embassy out of Tel Aviv—move it to Jerusalem, all right? Hey, you know that land you stole from Syria? Golan Heights—it’s yours. What did he get from his wife in the last election? Miriam Adelson. Not my numbers—some of the numbers I see, \$250 million, all right? Who owns CBS now? Oh, Ellison, pro-Zionist. And who did he bring into CBS? Bari Weiss, pro-Zionist. Oh, now his son’s bragging that they’ve got CNN? Yeah—pro-Zionist. “We love Israel.” Their quotes. And again, go back and talk about Biden. How about the clown lady that ran against him—Trump, rather—Kamala Harris? “Israel has the right to defend itself.” How much are you spewing out that line? Nobody else does, by the way.

Only a million people have been thrown out of their homes in Lebanon now. A million people. So get out of your house—everybody listening, get out of your house. “Hey, we’re Israel. We’re telling you to get out of your house as we bomb you.” Barely in the news. Oh, yesterday’s New York Times—I did it on my podcast, showed the article: two dead in Tel Aviv because of Iran bombing them. Two dead? This is a story? How many people did you slaughter in Palestine yesterday? What, Stein? Who, Stein? All right? So this is serious stuff. And again, go back to your Trends Journal—we warned about this. I did a podcast with Judge Napolitano on the Wednesday before February 28th, and I said they’re going to attack this weekend.

Trump was going way down in the polls. Here—Epstein files. The Department of Justice may have withheld FBI interviews with Trump’s accuser. Yep, everybody forgot about that. For the last few weeks, oversight Democrats have been investigating the FBI’s handling of allegations from 2019 of a sexual assault on a minor made against President Donald Trump. The facts are all there. This thing

was going down before—the equity markets were going down. And as I say, when all else fails, they take you to war. And that's what we warned about in the Trends Journal. We said it was going to happen over the weekend. It's there for everybody to read. And it happened.

Gerald, it seems the Trump administration thought this was going to be some sort of short attack on the Iranians—kill the leadership and everything would be okay afterward. It doesn't seem like they planned for the economic or military aspects of the war. How do you see the economy reacting to what's going on in the Strait of Hormuz?

Look at the equity markets—they're going down all over the world. Look at the inflation rate; it was going up way before this happened. Again, we warned, we've been writing this for years, months, and weeks, that if the United States invades or attacks Iran, you're going to see Brent crude go above \$100 a barrel, and possibly well over \$130 a barrel. And if that happens, you're going to see equity markets crash and the global economy go down. There's going to be what we call "dragflation." They're saying "stagflation"—no, it's not going to be stagnant; it's going to be dragging down the economy. Economies go down, inflation goes up. Again, it was a bad time before this happened. The equity markets were already going down before this.

We've been warning about a dot-com bust. We've been writing about how so many of these private equity groups—the people want their money, and they don't have the money. They won't give it back to them. Only 5% back, only 11% back. They don't have the money to cover this. Things are going down very badly. A bad time is going to get much worse. We are on—are you ready?—this is going to be the greatest depression, the worst we've ever seen in modern history, if this war does not end soon. And again, they asked Trump last Friday on Fox News—Brian Kilmeade—"When is this war going to end? When are you going to know when it's over?" Trump said, "When I feel it, when I feel it in my bones." How can you—what the hell is the matter with you?

Where's the outrage at saying something so stupid like that? Why, you anti-Trumper? Again, I'm a political atheist. To me, it's a crime syndicate. Again, cover your Trends Journal this week: from warmonger "Genocide Joe" to draft-dodger "Bombs Away" Trump. Don't forget to vote in the next election for your favorite political crime syndicate. And that's who's running the country. You got it? Trump says everything's been knocked out in Iran—yep, knocked out most of its military. This was over a week ago when that clown boy Mertz was here. Yep, yep. He said they have no Navy—it's been knocked out. They have no Air Force—it's been knocked out. They have no air detection—that's been knocked out. Their radar's been knocked out. No, it hasn't. Total lie. Total lie.

Yep. This is Trump, March 4th. "Their leadership is rapidly going. Everyone that wants to be a leader ends up dead. All right? It's a great display of military strength," Trump said. "We rebuilt our military

during my first term, and we're using it a little bit more than I thought." That's March 4th—March 4th, **Financial Times**: "Trump struggles to explain why he launched another war." We the people? Screw you. You're a little plantation worker on slave land here. I'm the president. Yep. And again, Marco Rubio said that we knew if we didn't preemptively go after them before they launched those attacks, Israel was poised to attack Iran first—and that's why we did it. Again, one piece of baloney after another.

One after another. Yep. He told ABC the U.S. and Israel strikes have been so successful that the candidates are all dead. "We don't know who's leading the country now. They don't know who's leading it," he told CNN. Yep. This is the Trump, they said, who vowed to end the U.S.'s "forever wars."

Gerald, when it comes to the economy, I think it's important—you've mentioned the war. If it doesn't end soon, that's going to bring a lot of difficulties for the economy. But how do you see the war influencing the Middle East economically, and what do you think the outcome will be?

Let's look at the data. Several days after the war began, the **Financial Times** reported—talk about the Middle East—Middle East tourism fell by \$600 million a day. That was then. So now, probably up to a billion. That's just tourism. Now let's take a trip to Europe. Hey, how about those energy prices, everybody? Oh, you think they're bad in the United States? People were going broke before this. Again, by the data, the top 1% in America is responsible for 50% of the spending. People were going broke before this—and all over the world. All over the world. Again, the Gen Z revolution—one of our top trends.

Young people have nothing. Look what just happened in Nepal—they just brought in a young guy from nowhere. Gen Z. What just happened in America? Oh, the biggest city in America, New York City—they elected this guy, Mamdani. Nobody ever heard of him before. How come? Gen Z. They're broke and busted. So this economy was going down before this. Look at Germany, the third-largest economy in the world—they were in a recession for two years. Oh no, but last year, Merkel—Chancellor Merkel—"our economy grew 0.2%." Get the hell out of here. What are you talking about? Basically, three years of recession before this happened.

UK—oh, the numbers just came out: negative GDP growth in the last quarter. One after another. All of this was going down before this war happened. A bad situation has become terrible. Again, read your **Trends Journal**. Go back—go back before this began. The equity markets were already going way down. Going back to the average person—hey, let's go back to Trump's State of the Union

address, all right? Not too long ago, just a couple of weeks ago. "Hey, no, no, no, President—the price of a gallon of gasoline in most states in America, \$2.30." Warning, warning—bullshit alert! It was \$2.91. You know what it is as we're speaking? Went up a buck.

Again, once upon a time, a first-time homebuyer was 28 years old—now he's 40. This whole thing was going bad before this happened. When all else fails, they take you to war. I mentioned Epstein. Again, read your *Trends Journal*. We said they were going to attack right after—the day he gave his speech, we wrote that they were going to attack in the coming weeks, if not that weekend. He was down in the polls. Economies were going down. Markets were going down. Hey, remember this one? "Now that I'm president, I brought the Dow up to 50,000. By the time I get out, it's going to be 100,000." Oh yeah? What's it now? About 46,000 and change—46,600. All right? Yeah.

No, this thing's terrible. It's going to destroy the global economy. The greatest depression is going to happen. And if we don't have a peace movement, it's going to be nuclear war. They asked this cat by the name of Einstein—he knew a thing or two about the atomic bomb—they asked him what kind of weapons would be used to fight the Third World War. He said, "I don't know, but they'll be using sticks and stones to fight the fourth." And to show you the...

What did the clown boy playing the Fed head, Jerome Powell, say? That the inflation rate that came out—it was high before this happened? "That's just temporary." It's not. Here, ready? March 2021: he said inflation would rise but be temporary. June 2021: inflation has increased notably but was, quote, "still transitory." July 2021: "It will be transitory." Ready? March 2021: he said a transitory rise in inflation seems likely. This is the BS. Yep. July 2021: "It'll be transitory." This is the clown boy saying it's temporary. How can you get away with this shit? I'll tell you how—because you've got shithheads running the show. And the media is nothing more than prostitutes. They don't have anybody on talking about peace. Don't have anybody on talking against this crap. Nope. Nope. They only put on people they want to keep selling the lies. Yep.

Actually, we had someone in the Trump administration who resigned just yesterday. And the day before, Joe Kent, the head of the Counterterrorism Center, also stepped down. He's not happy with Donald Trump or his administration when it comes to the new war in the Middle East—that's why he resigned. Joe Kent is one of the main MAGA supporters, I'd argue one of the core people behind the MAGA movement in the United States, who supported Donald Trump. Right now, they're not with him. And it doesn't seem that Donald Trump cares about these people, because he's in his second

term. Even J.D. Vance—yesterday we learned that he said he’s not considering running in the 2028 presidential election. So they’re prepared to go all in and destroy everything. Yeah.

Again, that’s one guy—good for him—but most of the MAGA crowd still supports him, according to the polls. The poll numbers are out. And here, speaking at an early morning conference, Secretary of Defense—this was March 4th—said the U.S. and Israel would, quote, “completely control,” end quote, the Iranian sky soon, allowing the U.S. to, quote, “fly all day, all night, finding, fixing, and finishing the Iranian military.” They’re toast. They know it, or they’ll know it soon enough. That was March 4th.

Look at this. Iran’s senior leaders are dead. The so-called governing council that would have selected successors, Hegsett added, are dead, missing, or cowering in bunkers—too terrified to even occupy the same room.

Who talks like this? You’ve got to be out of your mind. And then Trump—after they killed him, when they were going to put Khomeini’s son in—Trump said, quote, “They are wasting their time. Khomeini’s son is a lightweight. I have to be involved in the appointment.” You’ve got to be involved in the appointment of what another country is going to do? Like I did with Delcy Rodríguez in Venezuela. He added that he refuses to accept the new Iranian leader who would continue Khomeini’s policies, which he said would force the U.S. back to war, quote, “in five years.” Ready? “Khomeini’s son is unacceptable to me. I have to be involved in the appointment.” So now imagine if an Iranian leader said, “I have to be involved in the appointment of a new American president. I don’t like this guy.” Oh my God, the media would say how terrible that is—how could somebody say that? Hey, but Trump can say anything he wants. What if another country said what Trump is saying? “I’ve got to be involved.”

Gerald, I think the war in the Middle East is going to drastically change and reshape the whole region for a long time. We’ve seen U.S. bases across the region, kind of surrounding Iran. And right now, physically, most of them have been destroyed by the Iranian army. They don’t want those bases coming back into the region. Do you see any sort of sanity coming to the region—any of these Arab states realizing what’s at stake for them? Or are they going to keep this kind of relationship with the United States, when nobody even knows what the main goal is—if they’re attacked because of the bases in their countries, not because of something else?

By the way, Iran—again, we go to Press TV—what the Iranians have to say is that they're not the ones attacking a number of these bases. They're saying Israel and the United States are attacking. They say, yeah, they're attacking this one, that one, and that one—but not this one, that one, and that one. So we don't know what's going on. Again, false flag events all the time. But no, the Arab states—I don't see them—they're going to be against Iran. And the proof is that they've done nothing to stop the genocide, the Gaza war, in Israel. Go back to the 1970s when the Israel war went on—the Arab nations put an oil embargo on, and oil prices spiked in the United States. That ended the conflict. They didn't do anything this time. And again, as I mentioned, Donald Trump's son-in-law, Jared Kushner, got what?

Two billion dollars from Saudi Arabia? Trump's building all these Trump Towers and this and that, here and there throughout the Middle East? So they're all in the same club. And again, these places were invented just recently—they were nothing before. Saudi Arabia—when did that become a country? What, 1934? And what was one of the first things they did? They tried to steal land from the Yemenis that bordered them. Oh, the king, the king—shove this “king” crap word up your ass. The king, nobility. Yeah, I'm just a little guinea from the Bronx. As I say, the king of England dressed up in a little clown costume, a Halloween costume. If they were Italian, you'd call them a mafia—murderers. “The sun never sets on the British Empire.” We kill people all over the world.

Like the Dutch and the French—king crap, royalty. F you, royalty. What a bunch of shit. They think they're better than you are. And that's why people follow their leaders. Again, what Trump is—this crap he's spewing out—“He's my leader.” I'm still in kindergarten. Yep. Trump said last Friday that there would be no deal to end the U.S. war against Iran without unconditional surrender. They're not going to surrender. And again, Israel's driven us into this war. This is an Israeli war. What's his name said it—that little Rubio clown, little jerk, little boy, little freak show he's got around him. He said Israel is going to attack, right? And what is Netanyahu now saying? He wants oil to be delivered through Israel. Just came out with that today. And look what they're doing in Lebanon. No outrage. No outrage. No outrage. Yep.

I think one of the difficulties the Trump administration is facing right now is the Strait of Hormuz. They've been trying everything to bring the Europeans into it. That doesn't mean the Europeans aren't helping them—they are—but they don't want to go to the Strait of Hormuz. What's your assessment of the Europeans right now?

Well, the people probably hate this thing because it's costing them a ton of money—energy costs and everything else going up, shortages of food, this and that. No, they're against it. But remember,

Trump said they were going to support it. That's what he was saying back in 2014, March 14th. He said it, and now they're saying no. Again, go back—this is March 12th. Treasury Secretary Scott Besson said the U.S. Navy would begin escorting ships through the Strait of Hormuz as soon as militarily possible. So what did that do? Drove down oil prices. Let's go back to our other clown boy, Chris Wright.

I call him Chris Wright, the Energy Secretary. He said U.S. naval forces are bringing tankers through the Strait of Hormuz. Total lie. Brought down Brent crude. Let's go back. After Trump attacked on February 28th, gold prices spiked—spiked. Opened in the States, Trump comes out and says the war's almost complete already. Boop—down went prices. And again, I believe the markets are totally rigged. Totally rigged. The same guy, Besson, was on CNBC, and they asked, "Is the government rigging the oil prices?" He said, "We don't have any plans to." You don't have any plans?

How about saying we never do anything like that? Again, I wrote in the **Trends Journal**—it's your magazine—when gold prices went down, how JPMorgan Chase, in September 2020, was fined \$920 million for rigging the precious metals market. They're doing everything they can to rig these markets so it doesn't show the danger ahead. Silver and gold prices should be spiking through the roof. They're doing everything they can to keep the prices down. Everything. And they're going to keep doing it. Again, the biggest export product—**Wall Street Journal**: U.S. trade deficit shrunk 25%. Huh. You know why?

This is March 12th—driven by gold exports. All right? I've never heard of anything like this before. That's how strong the demand for gold is, and they're driving the prices down. Here, this is a headline for everybody to read.

And again, they're doing everything they can to drive down the markets. This was when the war began. They had this guy on CNBC—Steve Eisman—saying investors should ignore the U.S.-Iran war, that it'll be long-term positive. Steve Eisman, of **The Big Short** fame, said—this is from your **Trends Journal**, we're repeating—that investors should ignore the U.S.-Iran war as it could be a long-term positive for markets. Ready? In fact, when the investor was asked Monday by CNBC's Joe Kernan on **Squawk Box** whether he would change anything because of the conflict, he responded, "Not a single trade." So I looked up, who's this guy Eisman? **Middle East Eye** reported on September 2, 2024, quote, "Jewish American fund manager Steve Eisman says he is celebrating Gaza's destruction."

That's who they quote, all right? Jewish-American businessman Steve Eisman, a hedge fund manager known for betting on, you know, blah, blah, blah—social media said he was celebrating the destruction of Gaza. His comments were made in response to a graphic video showing burning

buildings and people suffering from the Israeli attack. He wrote, quote, "The world is silent. We're not silent." He said, "We're celebrating." What an evil piece of shit. What an evil piece of shit—that he's celebrating the murder of innocent people and the destruction of their homes. "Shut up, Celente! Why, you anti-Semite! How dare you say that!" All right? No one is allowed on mainstream media if you're against a genocide. Yep. Yep.

Gerald, just before we wrap up this session, we know that the U.S. defense budget has increased by \$600 billion since Donald Trump was elected. And then today—or maybe it was the day before—the U.S. Secretary of War, Pete Haxett, came out asking for \$200 billion more after just three weeks of the conflict, the war between Iran and the United States. Here's what Pete Haxett said, Joe.

I think that number could move, obviously. It takes money to kill bad guys. So we're going back to Congress and our folks there to make sure we're properly funded for what's been done and for what we may have to do in the future. We need to ensure our ammunition is—everything's refilled. And not just refilled, but above and beyond. I mean, President Trump, as he said, rebuilt the military in his first term. Didn't think he'd use it as dynamically in his second, but he has. So thank goodness he did that. An investment like this is meant to say, hey, we'll replace anything that was spent. And now we're reviving our defense industrial base, rebuilding the arsenal of freedom, and cutting deals like our great deputy secretaries here.

Yeah, you get the tone of what he's talking about.

#Gerald

You're talking about bad guys—how about the innocent people who are being killed, shithead? How about them? Now let's go back to more bullshit. Let's go back to last February. What did Trump say in February 2025? He said he was going to cut the defense budget by half a billion dollars. That was last February. What did he say this February? He was going to increase the defense budget by half a billion dollars. And now this clown boy wants at least another \$200 billion. We've already spent \$12 billion. The roads are rotting all over the place here. It's a joke. You drive—boom, boom, boom, boom, boom, boom, boom, boom. Right? I'm up in Kingston.

Right across the river is Rhinecliff, and the Amtrak is over there. Amcrap. My friend, a couple of months ago, took Amcrap to Montreal, Canada—ten hours. Ten hours each way. Ten hours up, ten hours back. I could drive to Montreal in four and a half hours up the thruway. Four and a half hours by car. Hey, how about those speed rails they have in China? Look at the roads, the country rotting

in front of our eyes. Homeless all over the streets. People going broke. And you've got an arrogant clown boy, a little Fox boy, Hegsitt, as defense secretary. Anybody that supports this war—put on your costumes and go fight, or shut your mouth. You got it? Again, Draft Dodger Trump.

I got a bone spur. I can't fight.

Yeah, the boy loves war. And he lied his way into office by calling himself a peace president. Again, one after another. We had all the quotes here—I can't find them, I don't know where I put them. But, um, one after another, he lied about how he was going to bring peace on earth, said he'd be the president for peace. And as a matter of fact, it was the cover of our magazine: "A man for peace or a piece of shit." And we have the quotes. Oh, you forgot when he was bombing the Houthis? He bombed Iraq. Oh, he bombed Iran last June. Oh, I forgot—he bombed Nigeria too. Oh, and he kidnapped the president of Venezuela and his wife.

Killing people in little speedboats 1,500 miles from here. They say they've got drugs in their boats. Oh, now it's all about oil. As I said, do you think the United States would have invaded Iraq, Syria, or Libya if their major export was broccoli? Now Venezuela brags about its oil. Here—one of my books, **Trend Tracking**, far better than **Megatrends** or **Time Magazine**—**How I Became a Trend Forecaster.** And here's the part about the Iran war. That's when I started, when I became a political atheist. Here it is—the Iran crisis. They taught the American people how to hate the revolution going on in Iran.

Little Jimmy Carter, the peanut farmer, came back and told the American people, "I spent New Year's Eve with the Shah and his wife, and the Shah is the island of stability in the Middle East." In the Bronx, we used to say, "Bullshit has its own sound." This thing's going down. And that's when I became a trend forecaster and a political atheist. I started playing the futures markets—gold and oil. I said prices were going to skyrocket, and they did. Anyway, they taught us to hate Iran. They told America, "Get the hell out of our country after you overthrew the Shah." We said, "We're not going to leave your country. Who the hell are you to tell us to leave your country?" They had the CIA over there in the embassy. They wanted to get them out of there.
