Hi, everybody. Today is Friday, May 22nd, 2026, and our dear friend, our brother Stanislav Krapivnik, is here with us. Welcome back, Stanislav.

## #Stanislav

Always a pleasure.

## #Nima

Always a pleasure. Yeah. Let's start with what is happening in the United States. Tulsi Gabbard resigned. And she was, in my opinion, one of the most important figures in the Trump administration, because before, you know, in January, when we thought that she was going to be part of the administration, we thought that she was going to be against the war in the Middle East. She was going to help Donald Trump in the case of the war in Ukraine. Nothing of that sort has happened. We have, you know, the continuation of the war in Ukraine, the war in the Middle East, which we didn't have before.

And she didn't do anything. She was against, you know, the expansion of American forces in the Middle East when it comes to Syria and those problems in Syria. She was advocating for withdrawing the troops from Syria. No more war in the Middle East, but we haven't heard that much from her position when the war against Iran started. And right now, if you remember, the Trump administration, the White House, by the way, if I'm not mistaken, a month ago, they announced that she had to resign before the midterm election. Right now, we've heard today, all of a sudden, we've learned that she resigned.

And because of her husband having some sort of bone cancer, that's why she has to, you know, help. She has to help him during the process of, you know, the medical process that he is in. And what is your understanding of Tulsi Gabbard? Is that going to be a big loss for the Trump administration? Or are they not going to be that influenced by, you know, by losing Tulsi Gabbard?

And it's not just about Tulsi Gabbard. And Marilys Fox, yesterday, she resigned as well. It seems to me that these resignations are somehow related to the war in the Middle East. Your understanding of what has happened?

You know, when you said something happened in America, that's just like, yeah, okay. Which time, this time of the day, did something happen in America? That's just kind of like, you know, the endless train wreck that is modern America. There was a prediction that most of the people that came in with Trump wouldn't be there by the end of the year. So a lot of them have made it past the end of the year, but they're falling out left and right. And Trump gets rid of a lot of people around him. And he's a bully about it too, by the way. We saw with Kent. Now there are investigations on Kent for telling the truth. And Kent left. And Trump mean-mouthed his people too, you know, after they leave.

He doesn't do it to their face, but he does it behind their back. With Tulsi Gabbard, you know, it's not a big loss, honestly speaking, at all. There was a lot of hope in her. But the first thing that kind of looked wrong is when Danny Davis—she wanted Danny Davis to be her assistant—and because he wouldn't bend the knee to the Israeli lobby, that was gone. So that already started the alarm bells ringing for anybody who's paying attention because, hey, she must have bent the knee. And her rhetoric started becoming more pro-Israeli. I'm sorry, I've got to change my position. I've got an old army injury that's flared up, so I've got to lift my leg up. It moved me down a little bit, but I'm still here.

So yeah, that was already one of those signs, but she was still against the Iran war, and she testified to Congress that Iran's not looking to make nuclear weapons, at which point she got back-slapped. And off she goes and becomes a wallflower. Now, to understand Tulsi Gabbard, she was the up-and-rising star in the Democratic Party until she fell out with the Democratic Party. She went over to the Republican Party. If she had just stayed a senator or she'd become someone of the sort, that'd be one thing. But she's now in the Trump administration, and if she gets gone from that, fired by Trump, her political career is pretty much over. She doesn't have a home.

America only has two sides of the same coin. So what do you do? Well, she kind of became a wallflower and nobody heard her. There were even people putting up mock posters of Tulsi Gabbard: "Have you seen this woman? You know, she's been missing in the White House for so many weeks." And the unfortunate part is all the hope that was placed in her, the things that she could get done. As we've seen with a lot of whole places, a lot of people, and Trump himself to begin with, it's all been misplaced because the end result—well, with her, I mean, she was neutered fast enough to serve the Israeli agenda.

Other people either got fired, left, or were never—were always with the Israeli agenda or the neocon agenda—and they were just pretending. And that includes Trump himself. You know, Trump's been

the biggest disappointment for most people, period. And you can watch some people, you know, they try to excuse him. They're trying to excuse him. And as time went on, they stopped excusing him. Some people are still trying to excuse him. Most of MAGA, actual MAGA, left. Because they weren't MAGA. What's left is MAGA. Or maybe MIDGA—Make Trump Great Again. Those are his groupie cult followers that are left. These are people that bought Trump coins, which are down by 96% from their high.

So, you know, to be part of the Trump family, gave him \$30 billion as a present for him and Melania, because Melania also had Melania coins that came out. This is the reality of it. And like I said, unfortunately, she got very little done. She did give us some insights early on into Trump. I remember it was February of last year, maybe it was even March, where she was talking about how, because Trump doesn't like to read, that should be setting off alarm bells already in people's minds. Because Trump doesn't like to read, they had to rearrange the briefs for the president from, you know, having papers with words on it to something that looked like a Fox News brief.

And what's a Fox News brief? If you look at Fox News or CNN or any of this crap, at best—and I'm not even talking about propaganda—I'm just talking about news value. At best, you skim the very top of an issue. They give you the loud-sounding headlines and just skim a little bit of the fat off the top, and you really—you know enough to not know anything. You know enough to have your opinion formed by someone else. And when that's the brief for the President of the United States on things, you know, that's bad. That's very bad. Especially a man like Trump, who really doesn't know a lot about most things when it comes to any world affairs. And he totally does not know economics. We know that. And all the fools that believed him when he said, you know, the evil manufacturers—why they're evil, I'm not quite sure—but the evil manufacturers will pay the tariffs.

Well, no.

## **#Stanislav**

But, you know, the majority of American people believed them. And this is just as an example. So when she gave that view that, you know, the briefs are going to be like this, you know, why is anybody then surprised when they find out that Trump's Iran war briefs were two minutes of things America blowing up? You know, not American things blowing up, but only the things America is blowing up for two minutes. And that's it. That's all you need to know, Mr. President, about the war

that you've started for today. So unfortunately, yeah, she just didn't just underperform. She was a total disappointment and failure.

Yeah. Actually, she gave us a briefing. You remember, a briefing on Iran and the nuclear program. And she said there is no sign that Iran is pursuing nuclear weapons. Then Donald Trump came out before the war started, before the first round of wars. Donald Trump said, I don't care what she said.

Yeah. Come here, Tulsii. Come here. Back in the closet. If we want to hear from you, we'll pull you out and squeeze your head.

## **#Nima**

That was the end, I think. We haven't heard much from her since then. And when the war started, we haven't heard anything.

## **#Stanislav**

I mean, I hope her husband doesn't have cancer. Bone cancer—well, any kind of cancer—is a bitch. Bone cancer is one of the worst. And, you know, I pray that everything goes well for her. But as a member of the cabinet, absolute disappointment, absolute disappointment.

But when you're in an administration like the Trump administration, what else can you do?

## **#Stanislav**

Everybody's against you. You know what you can do? Yes, Massa. What do you want me to say, Massa? You tell me what you want me to think, Massa. I repeat whatever you say, Massa. Yes, Massa. You're the man, Massa. You're always right, Massa. That's right. That's the way you survive in the Trump administration. Exactly. His ego. That's it. That's it. No matter how stupid a thing he says, yes, Massa, you're the man, Massa. That's it. That's... And if you're not willing to do that, if you have any decency, any self-respect, you know, figure out who you're about to serve. And it's not the American people. It's not your constituents. So it's... You know, that's who you have in power.

Yeah. That's why we had Joe Kent resign from his position, because he couldn't do anything about it.

## **#Stanislav**

And, you know, he went after Kent. Kent's wife, who's CIA, she died from the head chopper Jelani's people, who, by the way, Trump with pride said, "He's my man, and I put him into power." You know, the guy that's swimming in blood—Christian blood, hallowed blood, sheer blood—you know, the guy they've got photos of killing, by the way, Americans, cutting women's and children's heads off. I mean, he wasn't exactly camera-shy about that. But now he's playing basketball with CENTCOM command. Yeah.

## **#Nima**

Just two days ago, he received two perfumes as a special gift from Donald Trump.

## **#Stanislav**

The child of death, the smell of a dead child and a dead woman, you know, something like that, you know, a rotting corpse.

## **#Nima**

This is how reality gets distorted.

## **#Stanislav**

Yeah, you know, my question was, after he visited the Trump administration, did Trump wash the blood of little children off his hands, or did he lick it off his hands?

## **#Nima**

Yeah. Stan, when you look at the situation between Israel and Lebanon, you've seen what Hezbollah is doing right now. What is your understanding of the strategy of Hezbollah, and how effective is that in your opinion?

## **#Stanislav**

With what Hezbollah has, I think they're pretty effective. Israel is out to wipe the land clean. Israeli Zionist backers in the West are there to make sure they help. Apple, by the way—Apple Maps—Ethan Levins, if you know who he is, I was talking with him. He was the first one that saw and published the Apple Maps that had wiped all the Lebanese settlements off of southern Lebanon except for Tyre. You know, 3,000-year-old villages, all their names disappeared because they're

preparing to replace them with Israeli names. And Israel is out to not just murder off anybody that's left, that hasn't gone, and keep killing them as they've left, but Israel is trying to exterminate any evidence that these people ever existed.

I mean, these villages are 3,000 years old, some are older. They've survived. I mean, much of their population has been killed many times because of different waves of invaders or wars. The villages have survived. People repopulated them. Tyre is a city—it's, what, about 4,500, 5,000 years old, somewhere around there. Alexander the Great was building quite literally a bridge from the mainland to the original city of Tyre, which was an island. We have plenty of evidence and everything, archaeological evidence, of how old the city is. The Israelis gave them orders to leave. So they're telling sovereign people, a sovereign nation, you have to leave.

If you don't, we're going to level all these buildings anyway and wipe the city out because it's not our city. So we'll just exterminate our history and everything else. The Israelis are an out-of-control, psychopathic regime. And the problem with that regime is, replacing Netanyahu will actually make things worse. That's the lunacy that you live in. You know, there's 20, maybe 30% of the population that's against all of this. 70%, maybe 80%, somewhere between that, is all for this. And they want it worse. They want more murder. They want more genocide. They want more dog rapes of prisoners. They want more hangings. They want more organs taken out.

They want more. They can't get enough of the blood. They frigging could not get enough of the blood. I mean, when people get on grassy knolls and have picnics watching other people get murdered, when settlers bring their children on the boats and ride up and down the Gaza Strip at night watching Gaza getting destroyed and telling their children, this is where you're going to be living as soon as we get rid of this vermin. And this is not conjecture. This is videotaped. They post it on the Internet with pride. So this isn't something, you know, Stas decided to make up as, you know, maybe he's crazy. This is videos, their own videos.

These are programs against the Palestinian villages, and not just Palestinian Muslim villages—Palestinian Christian villages. They go out there and they burn people alive in their houses. They destroy their crops. They steal their sheep. I mean, just look at Jerusalem. Jerusalem used to be a quarter Christian. It's a hell of a lot less than that now. And, you know, you get Christians assaulted every single day—priests, nuns. We just had that recent incident where a nun was pushed and kicked by one of these psychopaths. I mean, this is something that's a very sick society. And God forbid in that society, if you're an Oriental Christian, a Jew, a traditional Jew—you know, one of the people who actually lived there long before the ones from Europe arrived.

The ones that, you know, said, "We were here before Israel, we'll be here after Israel"—those people get beaten even worse than the Palestinians because they're seen as race traitors. You know, this is a very sick society whose first and foremost action on anything is violence, including against each other. I mean, this is... I don't know how else to describe it. When Israeli snipers start whacking themselves because I guess putting bullets in children's heads finally got to them, and

they're screaming at night and are drugged up because they've killed so many children—at least they had some humanity left in them to make them feel guilty. I don't think a lot of them even have that.

This is what we're facing. And as long as the European psychopaths, and not to mention the American psychopaths, are backing it full tilt—remember what Merz said—they're doing civilization's dirty work. So, in other words, if you're not part of the EU or the US, you're not civilized, you're animals to be cleared. Whether you're Shia, whether you're Sunni, whether you're Orthodox, whether you're Buddhist, whether you're anything else, you're just animals to be cleared. That's the message that everybody should have heard. The rest of humanity should have heard. These psychopaths, they're not done. We beat their grandfathers' teeth in when they came last time, the brown plague, and the brown plague's up again.

And we're going to have to do it all over again, except this time leave them in ruins. I mean, we're back to the Nazis. Except the Zionist Jews, anyway, are now part of the club. So we're back to the Nazis. And Europe is, you know, there's a reason the U.S. unblocked its archives on Germans that it had taken from Germany, on Germans, on who was, you know, on their backgrounds from the 1940s, from the early 1940s—whose grandfather was in the SS or Gestapo and all that—and they've now opened it up. It's to normalize for the German population. Go look up your granddad. Yeah, he was a Nazi. See, it's okay. Nazis are good. It's good. Be a Nazi again. And they're doing this on purpose. It's everywhere in the West. It's permeating everything in the West.

**#Stanislav**

Cool.

**#Nima**

Do we know how many of these Iron Dome batteries Israel produces per year, or are other countries producing them for Israel? Because at least in the last two or three days, we've seen five or six of them being hit by FAA drones. And what do we know about that?

**#Stanislav**

Well, the Iron Dome can't stop ballistic missiles. It's not made for that. It can do drones, particularly like Shahed-1 drones. They're pretty slow, and they're loud and noisy. The more modern Shaheds are based off the Russian Gerans. I don't think they can stop those. They fly higher, they're a lot faster. And I'm not even talking about the Geran-3s, which are jet-powered. There's nothing it can

really do with those, and they're maneuvering. But the older versions, the first versions, yeah, they're pretty slow. But hey, they took out American radar systems that are worth half a billion dollars. So, you know, you want to talk about a payoff—whoever piloted that one should have gotten a bonus from the Iranian government.

But if you're looking at what they were created for, it was to deal with the rockets that Hamas was firing. Now, Hamas is firing rockets into Israel. They're pretty dumb, homemade rockets. I mean, pretty much they're just ballistic rockets. There's no guiding them in. They just fire off a bunch of them, and they land wherever, right? And in a general direction. They're not much of a payload. I mean, this is homemade stuff, basically. What Iron Dome did—the smart part of Iron Dome—is the radar calculations. Because what they do is they pick up all the rockets, and they're just ballistic arcs. They've got the parabolic arc, and they're calculating where they're going to land and what's there.

And if it's not a village or a built-up area or some base, they just let it go. Maybe there's one or two houses out there. It's just not worth shooting them because it's too expensive. Stuff that's heading into some village or some base, they'll start shooting that. And they were pretty damn effective against that kind of weapon. Iran's shooting ballistic missiles in. PAC-3s barely handle ballistic missiles. PAC-2s aren't designed for it. We've seen PAC-2s firing off—and this is Patriot PAC-2s—firing up to one count. There was one, I think there were seven or eight missiles they fired off, and the ballistic missile just flies right past all of them, blows up somewhere.

You know, a camera turned, and somewhere a couple of buildings over blew up. That's the reality. Iron Dome can't do anything about that. So Iron Dome in Abu Dhabi would be good for any slow drones or maybe very slow cruise missiles, though that's questionable. So it's there. Part of the missile components are manufactured in the U.S., part in Israel, but they're pretty low on ammunition these days. They can only produce so much so fast. So any system can be overwhelmed. And, yes, you're right. I've watched—I've got one of these videos I'm going to put in, actually part of my update that I'm going to videotape after this—where one of these Iron Domes is taken out, one of the launchers taken out by an FPV drone.

Yeah. And the problem is for Israel, you know, Israel is relatively small, and these R&D missiles don't have that long of a range. So like it or not, you've got to get them close enough to the border so they don't have to fly that far. And by the way, for the Israelis, this is a disaster not just because this one launcher was taken out, but because they've got tanks, they've got other equipment. It's all been taken out on the Israeli side now, not even the stuff that's inside Lebanon. And Lebanon has been a very bloody nose for them.

I mean, yeah, sure, they're great at taking out whole villages, especially when there's nobody there—blowing them up, demolitions, or shooting, dropping 2,000-pound bombs onto 10-story apartment buildings to take out everybody in it. Oh, they're good at that. But fighting face-to-face, or worse, drone-to-face, with Hezbollah has been an unmitigated disaster for the Israelis. So we'll see how

that goes, how long they can keep swallowing. But right now, I mean, they're rabid with a taste of blood. You saw that with the last Freedom Flotilla.

Yeah.

## **#Stanislav**

They've started picking some of those off 1,000 kilometers out. A lot of them were picked off over 500 kilometers out. That's international waters. You're not defending your waters; that's international waters. That's called piracy. But worst of all wasn't the beatings, the sexual assaults, the humiliations of these volunteers who were all unarmed civilians. That's not the worst that came out of this, what the Israelis did to them. The worst is when they get dropped off in Cyprus and places like that, and what the European governments did— a lot of their own citizens— they just didn't give a damn. And not just the European governments, New Zealand and Australia.

New Zealand told the New Zealanders there, these people have been stripped of their documents. They've been stripped of their money. And the New Zealand government told them, it's your problem, not ours. Survive however you want. They wouldn't give them any help from the embassy. I mean, this is how spinelessly pathetic... the parasite class of the EU and Western governments are. They're parasites. Oh, they'll take, they'll take. But they break that social contract instantly because they're all bought and paid for by somebody else. And look, the Republican Party in America— Massey being gone—who's left? Ron Paul, Rand Paul. I'm sorry. Yeah, pretty much that's it.

Laura Loomer today said that he's going to be next in line. They're going to go after him.

## **#Stanislav**

Of course they are. The Republican Party needs to go ahead. And the Democrats aren't that far behind. They're about 80% there. The Republican Party is basically 99.9% there. The Republican Party might as well register as a foreign agent under the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1948, because they are a foreign agent. They have no representation of the American people. They are an absolutely owned entity, and they are all getting paid by people through a foreign government. They represent that foreign government. I mean, Ted Cruz told everything on Tucker: "I wanted to be the best defender. I wanted to go to the Senate. I wanted to be the best defender of Israel in the Senate." Not the people of Texas that elected this parasite, but of the Israeli government.

I mean, that should be an instant disqualifier of, you know, being a member of parliament—of any parliament. If somebody says something like that, okay, we're stripping you of your mandate. Go

have a special election, and you're banned from running. That should be something that the parliament votes on. You don't have that kind of law in the U.S., but Russia does, by the way. Russia does. They can strip a member of parliament of their mandate if they do something like that, or if they have dual citizenship and they didn't disclose it, because you're not allowed to be a member of parliament if you have dual citizenship.

In the U.S. that's not a problem. It's very questionable how many of those people have dual citizenship with Israel. If you're a citizen and you have dual citizenship, by the way, if your governor allows it, no problem. But if you go into politics, you can't have dual loyalty. I think the guy who's replacing Tulsi Gabbard, I don't know if he's Israeli or—I don't know, I have no...

### **#Nima**

His name is Aaron Lucas, if I'm not mistaken.

### **#Stanislav**

He might as well be Israeli. What does it really matter?

### **#Nima**

Yeah, it doesn't matter. At the end of the day, they own Donald Trump. It doesn't matter who's...

### **#Stanislav**

Absolutely. And, you know, people were saying in the operations room, when Netanyahu came in, he would sit at the head of the table and Trump would sit at the side. Yeah. Owned. Very, very owned.

### **#Nima**

How do you understand Donald Trump withdrawing troops from Germany and sending more troops to Poland? What is that about? And what is Russia's position on that?

### **#Stanislav**

That's very hard to understand, particularly because he just withdrew troops from Germany, the 82nd Airborne Division.

### **#Nima**

He's talking about 5,000 troops being sent to Poland. Why is that?

## **#Stanislav**

It's so strange, guys. He was withdrawing the Stryker Brigade out of Vilseck, Germany. I used to serve in Vilseck, Germany. I was in 3rd ID. I'm sorry, not 3rd ID—3rd Brigade, 1ID, the Big Red One, stationed in Vilseck. It's very hard to understand what he's doing, and if he'll actually go through with it. On the one side, though, Poland wants to be the biggest whore of America, of all the other whores of America. "I'm your favorite. Slap me around. I'm your favorite, Mr. Pimp. I'm better than those others." That's kind of what Poland keeps screaming. Does it ever help Poland? Not really. No, never. I mean, Poland—let's not forget the Polish governments in the 90s built training camps and helped train the Ukrainian Nazis, whose grandfathers murdered 300,000 Poles.

And if you don't have a strong stomach, don't look at the archival photos that they took, because Nazis liked to take photos of their victims. It doesn't matter—they're Germans, Ukrainians, Italians, Hungarians, Jews, Zionist Jews—they're all the same. It's the same mental disease. They loved to take photos of their victims. I don't know what it is about it, but they did. And if you don't have a strong stomach for those types of atrocities, don't look at the archival photos of how they butchered the people, the Polish population in that area. They butchered a lot of what are now called Ukrainians, too, if they didn't have the same political views as them. Overall, they killed about a million people.

So... and by the way, Canada is returning the remains of these various Ukrainian Nazis to be buried in a big memorial ceremony in a big memorial park outside of Kyiv, bringing home the Nazis. You know, Poland—the Polish people—I don't know why they keep voting for these idiots in government that they've had for 30 years. They don't represent their interests. Poland is not better off than it was. Definitely not the population. And feeding the Nazis that, by the way, hate Poles almost as much as they hate us Russians. You know, if you're hoping they all die on the battlefield, you're still going to have problems with it. And it's never that clean-cut. So I don't know. Poland has been on a politically self-destructive route for 30 years, and they don't look like they're getting off it.

By the way, there are many good people in Poland, but the leadership and those people who are running the show, like Sikorski, like the president, these are problematic people—so much connected to the neocons in the United States.

## **#Stanislav**

Sikorski, otherwise known as Mr. Applebaum.

## **#Nima**

Yeah.

## **#Stanislav**

Sikorski is a British citizen. Sikorski's son is serving in the U.S. Army.

## **#Nima**

Yeah.

## **#Stanislav**

He's a dual citizen, and he's the foreign minister of Poland. You cannot have people like that in those kinds of positions with multiple citizenships. I'm sorry, one second. I'll reposition myself. This is the problem with old injuries. They give us these huge wads of ibuprofen, 1,200 milligrams—horse pills. You know, got a headache, mind took off your foot, go eat some ibuprofen, don't worry about it. Worry about it later. Not everybody got to live to later, but I did, and later came. Flares up once in a while. It's part of life.

## **#Nima**

So, the situation in Ukraine is headed toward escalation, you see, because from what I've seen and heard so far, there are a lot of pressures on Vladimir Putin because of the attack on that college dormitory in Russia on civilians by Ukrainian drones. And how is that going to play out for Ukraine? And what would be the response from Russia?

## **#Stanislav**

There's a lot of pressure on Vladimir Vladimirovich for the attack on Moscow, for this, for that, for everything. Look, the majority of Russian people, yeah, they want this war to end. They want this war to end with Kyiv flattened, Zelensky burning on a pyre, and the rest of them with their heads on spikes. And I'm being quite serious when I'm saying that. You know, you want to raise the presidential ratings up to close to about 100 percent, you put Zelensky's head on a spike. And I'm quite serious. The Russian people want blood. They really want blood. And I, you know, I was on RT today and we were discussing that.

And I said, you know, if I went to my neighbor and said, I want you to kill my other neighbor, and I trained that neighbor, and I put a loaded gun in that neighbor's hand, and I pushed him to go shoot that other neighbor, in any court of law, I am just as guilty of that murder as the guy that pulled the trigger. So following that, those parasites that sit in Europe, that European elite, are mass-murdering bastards just as guilty of every one of these crimes as the Ukrainian drone operator that drove that drone into a dorm with 17-, 18-year-old kids in it. Freshmen. Merkel is just as guilty, by the way, because she helped set this up, the stage. So she's not off on this, or Hollande.

But definitely Macron, Merz, every little bastard around them, von der Leyen, all of them are guilty mass murderers. Every single last one of those little brown and brown-as-a-Nazi bastards. You know, the brown plague, that Nazi plague, they all are part of it. So, yeah, this is going to get escalated. It needs to get escalated into Europe itself. Look, you know, not in Russian Europe or 42% of Europe. You know, at this point, the gloves need to come off. Iran showed, you know, you slap around 13 American bases and, no, there's no nuclear war. It's time to start cleaning house. There's a Polish base across the border. That's the staging ground that needs to be wiped out. Three top frontrunners for being the negotiator: Kaja Kallas, Merz, and Merkel. No, they're not negotiating. You know, they sent the Vice President of the United States to Islamabad, who was not—J.D. Vance was not prepared to talk with Iranians. Right now, they're sending messages. Pakistan. What the?

## **#Stanislav**

It's like, you know what it is when you're in second grade and you like a girl over there and you're afraid to tell her, so you write a note, "Do you like me?" and you give it to a friend, "Here, take it to her." You know, that's what there seems to be.

## **#Nima**

It's unbelievable what's going on. Yeah.

## **#Stanislav**

Yeah.

## **#Nima**

You know, these are the signs that show that they're not serious. They don't want to. I don't know what's in it for them, because maybe he's manipulating the market. He's making a lot of money by these manipulations. Absolutely, that could be one of the reasons.

## **#Stanislav**

No, no, no. Wait, wait, wait. Stop, stop, stop. J.D. Vance explained that Trump's not manipulating the market. He has people who do his investments for him. There's no insider here. There's no insider. He has people who do his investments.

## **#Nima**

Yeah, he said that Donald Trump himself is not doing this, but he has people.

## **#Stanislav**

Oh, yeah, yeah, yeah. He's a rich man. He has people to handle his wealth, you know, and he's against any kind of corruption. Like, you know, you got 30 minutes for the short position, and I'm getting ready to come out, you know.

## **#Nima**

I think Paul Craig Roberts mentioned that. He said maybe in the history of the United States, this is the first time they have a president who's doing business while he's in office and he's making decisions. And many people around him know what's going on. They're going to bet, they're going to invest, they're going to do this and that, making a lot of money. So the chaos is helping him. People are talking about it. He doesn't care. He himself said he doesn't care about the financial system, the financial problems of the American people. Who cares about those people? He's building the ballroom, his company.

## **#Stanislav**

It's a billion dollars.

## **#Nima**

It's just... his sons are producing weapons, missiles.

## **#Stanislav**

His sons and his son-in-law are producing land contracts when they go to, quote, negotiate, you know, for development. That's what they're doing, plus Woodcock. I mean, this is—look at the great negotiators in the United States, I mean, for God's sakes. Kushner and Woodcock?

## **#Nima**

Kushner and Witkoff, repeat with me: Kushner and Witkoff are the smartest two negotiators in America. They know nothing about the nuclear program, they know nothing about the nuclear negotiations. They just went there to talk. They thought it was going to be something about money, but there is no money in that. This is the problem. Oh, but they're very good with the Arabs, you know.

## **#Stanislav**

Just go over there and say, "Hey, we need \$100 billion."

## **#Nima**

Just imagine going there, talking with Iranian Foreign Minister Zarif, who was part of the negotiations during the JCPOA, who knows each and every angle of the nuclear program and negotiations, and talking with Steve Witkoff and Jared Kushner, who just came out of it. It's dumb and dumber, man. It is dumb and dumber.

You know, Marandi was telling me, Professor Marandi, Saeed was telling me that, you know, he's watching J.D. Vance, you know, call Netanyahu some four times. So the vice president of the United States, in negotiating a peace deal, is calling and getting marching orders from Netanyahu.

There is no dignity there.

## **#Stanislav**

Oh, and then Netanyahu made sure the world knew about it, too. I mean, this is a shaming exercise. Put you in your place, little Mr. Vance. I'm your daddy. You know, who's your daddy? I'm your daddy. You know, this is ridiculous. But, you know, when the Republican Party is a foreign agent...

## **#Stanislav**

Yeah, they might as well just change the flag. At least put the Israeli flag next to the U.S. flag in the White House, or over it.

## **#Nima**

But Donald Trump is receiving a lot of—GCC countries are not in a good position right now. They're feeling a lot of pain. Their economies are shrinking. They cannot sell oil and gas, fertilizers. That's why I think Donald Trump, at least he somehow pretends that he wants to put an end to the war, at least. But that's not going to happen. That's not going to happen anytime soon.

## **#Stanislav**

You know, the neocon faction, out of the three factions—you have the neocons, you have the Zionist Jews, and you have the Zionist Christians—it's just steadily getting more insane as you go down that

## **#Stanislav**

Yep, the best thing Trump can do at this point is walk away. The oil shock is here. I mean, you know, the only reason it's not as bad as it could be is because everybody's feeding off their reserves. But those reserves—the reserves for the UK, Germany, and France—are all expected to run out in the first half of June, maybe mid-June. So about two weeks, two, maybe three weeks, that's it. They're buying up the American—when troops... oh yeah, all these ships are coming in and all these tankers to buy up oil. We have access to—no, you have... the U.S. is a net importer of oil. What you have is your reserves that you're just dumping on the market.

And those were only at 50% or so from before COVID. And when that runs out, I mean, when you're not even using your national reserves for your nation, you know, all these other Middle Eastern countries, they went to China and said, yeah, can we buy off your reserves? And China said, no. No. This is the grasshoppers bouncing as winter's coming.

## **#Nima**

Knock, knock, Mr. Ant, can you give me some food?

## **#Stanislav**

No. Why didn't you build up your reserves? Oh, you didn't think you needed to. Well, you know, we did. So we—bye-bye. Survive the best you can. But the U.S. is quite the opposite. The grasshoppers can bounce off.

## **#Nima**

Sure, take everything you want.

## **#Stanislav**

Oh, and screw my other ants in my ant nest. They don't need it. So at this point, if I were the American people and understood anything about economics, I'd be getting very worried and upset.

## **#Nima**

Pakistan is doing this right now, Seth. Pakistan.

## **#Stanislav**

Yeah. If you're not angry yet, go climb under a rock. You'll never get angry, yeah, you know.

## **#Nima**

And if the war—by the way, if they start a new round of war—it's gonna, Iran said it's not gonna be regional. It's gonna go beyond the region, and I'm sure that they're gonna hit something in Greece, Diego Garcia, maybe Germany, Romania, maybe all these countries.

## **#Stanislav**

Well, they can't reach Romania. I mean, no, I'm sorry. They can't reach Germany, but they can reach Romania. There's a big NATO base there. But it doesn't have to go—it can stay regional. If you take out the electric power capacity in most of these countries, that's it. You know, there's no war. Let's just begin with that. It's 45, 50 degrees right now. Kuwait gets up to 55. You know, I've been in 50-degree heat. That's up in Kazakhstan. Kazakhstan, those areas—Western Kazakhstan along the Caspian—will get up to 50, 55. Most of the time it's 40, 45. And then winter's minus 30, of course. We're a little bit different in those areas.

But man, you know, 50 degrees, the last thing you want to do is put on a flak vest, body armor, grab a whole lot of equipment, and start trying to run. And the worst is, in Kazakhstan where I was working, it was a dry heat. In those areas, if you're trying to grab an island or two or what have you, man, it's 100% humidity. And in that kind of heat, you're going to have heat casualties left and right,

let alone bullets and drones. But yeah, I don't know what Trump is thinking. I don't think anybody—I don't think Trump knows what Trump is thinking. Yeah, he doesn't know. It's like you hit it in a computer, auto-generate a message.

It's random.

**#Stanislav**

Random words get put together, and you try to figure out what the random words this week are going to be, or this hour. I think that somewhere there's an auto-generator in Trump's mind that kind of works that way. We laugh, but I mean, we're in very dangerous... Yeah, we laugh, but it's tragedy.

It's a tragedy. People are getting killed.

**#Stanislav**

They're getting murdered by these policies. Yeah, we're in extremely dangerous waters.

Sorry, I was bouncing around. I kept having to move my foot around.

**#Nima**

Understandable.

**#Stanislav**

Yeah.

**#Stanislav**

Thank you. Some injuries, they'll make themselves known for a while—like the rest of your life.

**#Nima**

Yep.

**#Nima**
