

Andrei Martyanov: Russia's Zircon Missiles & TU-95s HAMMER Kiev, This War is OVER

Welcome to the show, everyone. It's Danny Haiphong. I have Andrei Martyanov here to help me break down the latest news. We begin in Ukraine, where a massive Russian attack that began with eight bombers targeting Kiev ended with, according to the Ukrainians, the following events. We saw 351 attack and decoy drones launched. We saw 25 ballistic missiles, the Iskander-M, eight hypersonic missiles, the Zircon, 25 cruise missiles, the X-101, the Iskander-K, six of those, and six cruise missiles, the Kalibr. And at one point, there were about 20 ballistic missiles that were launched in just a matter of 15 minutes.

Now, Andrei, this comes—hold on one second—this comes as Konstantinovka had been liberated just days before, and Zelensky, hours before this strike, had warned that they were defenseless against this coming attack. And that ended up being true, as zero defense interceptors ended up striking down any of these missiles in particular. Andrei, maybe you can help us understand the mechanics of this attack. And also, this is the second one in about four days, which indicates a level of escalation. I'm wondering if you can help us understand why and what the actual effect of these strikes are.

There is nothing really to understand there. It has been very clearly stated after the terrorist act of NATO against Tarabysk students, killing children, that now it's going to be constant. And so I don't know what to say about it, because Russians have had enough, because when you kill children, that

pretty much tells you everything you need to know about who they are and who controls the Kiev regime. And so that will continue, and sometimes it will increase in intensity, sometimes it will lower itself a little bit, but it's consistent. That was the term used by Vladimir Putin, Sergei Lavrov, and all kinds of the Russian top brass. Yeah, that's consistent, and they will be doing this now nonstop. Yeah, the gloves came off in the sense that the regime has to be demolished completely. And what can I say?

MRAO, which is a massive missile aviation strike, it's a combined strike. That means it is being launched from different means, be them ground complexes or the Navy. The Russian Black Sea Fleet strikes Ukraine constantly. Yeah, this is the fleet that was allegedly sunk, you know, you understand that. So yeah, that's what it is. They obviously generate targets, they know the targets most of the time. But the difference now is they don't care anymore. The Kyiv population and diplomatic corps have been warned from the get-go, after Star Abyss, to get the hell out of Kyiv. And this time, Russians are not avoiding those targets, which is standard for NATO—to hide behind their civilian backs. They blockade whatever they have left in terms of their air defense. They still do have some. It's not good.

We have now the videos of them failing to intercept anything. And yeah, this will continue while the pulverization or extermination of the remnants of the armed forces of Ukraine will continue on the front line. And yeah, I don't know what they expect. Russians have been patient enough. They have been playing this diplomatic game. And that's what you do. That's what strong countries, you know, powerful countries do. And now they pretend that, oh my God, you know, something happened. Yeah, you killed children. We just had yesterday, or the last two days, the funeral proceedings for Ayatollah Khamenei and his family, including little children. And obviously then, of course, the United States covered itself with glory for eternity by killing 171 children in the school of Minab and then attacking the gymnasium and other children.

And then the main U.S. ally, so to speak—in reality, the owner, master of the United States—Israel, they conduct outright genocide there. So, and everything's fine, you know, that's what they do. They're not good at fighting real war, but yeah, killing civilians—they try to basically project this modus operandi, so to speak, onto Russia. This is a different animal altogether, if you wish. And so now they get—well, Russians now openly are hunting down the NATO so-called advisors. They hunt them and kill them. So that's what's gonna happen. And now the question is, well, the core issue is if Russians are gonna go for NATO countries, which may happen. And again, I am not privy to any workings of the Russian Security Council, and obviously the briefings, intelligence briefings, and military briefings they get. But those are smart people, those high-level professionals, and so they know what they are doing.

Yeah, well, it may come as a shock to J.D. Vance that this attack occurred because just days before, or the day before, I should say, he was on the media saying before this NATO summit that Russia

has zero offensive capabilities in the war with Ukraine. It's approaching zero, but yet—I'll just pull it back up—this doesn't look like zero capabilities, Andrei. And I'm wondering if you can help us understand what some of these weapons are that, every time they're used, seem to shock the collective West. They seem to, you know, spread a lot of fear about them. And I'm wondering if you could talk about especially the hypersonic missiles—the Zircon, the Iskander missiles. What are these, and why is it significant that Russia is able to seemingly use these at will, use these in large numbers, and do so consistently over the matter of months to years now?

Well, J.D. Vance, for starters, he is no military professional. Well, actually, the overall professional level of the Pentagon, and especially European armies too, is extremely low. They cannot grasp the realities of the modern technological paradigm, if you wish. And J.D. Vance, he went through the ROTC, which is a fraud, basically, preparing what passes for officers in the United States Armed Forces. So he was a journalist. He was a communications officer. That means he won't understand even basic tactical things, let alone how operations are planned and what modern technologies are. He's basically a militant, humanities-brainwashed journalist, you know, person. That's who he is. And so obviously, explaining to people even the difference between the real hypersonic weapons—Iskander is hypersonic by definition because it's a ballistic missile, highly maneuverable.

Well, it's ballistic. It can fly the standard ballistic trajectory. But in reality, it is maneuverable and can fly on a depressed ballistic trajectory and violently maneuvers while approaching the target. And it reaches the target because it doesn't fly under its own power after the boost phase. It still approaches the target at about Mach 6, 6.5, 7. So Zircon is altogether different—different animal. This is a weapon which nobody, including China, has—not even close. It is a weapon which is Mach 9. It flies basically constantly under its own power. It approaches the target with Mach 9. People saw how it happens when it was demonstrated about a month ago against Kyiv. You could see four Zircons flying in. You cannot intercept it. And this one has very variable, so to speak, trajectories of approach.

It can either fly and attack vertically down, or it can have a less steep, if you wish, less sloped or gradient approach to the target. It can actually fly—it just matters in terms of the range, depending on the type of trajectory. Traditionally, it goes up to 20 kilometers, where there is less air density, and then it accelerates to Mach 10, and then approaches the target and strikes down. So it has a range of 1,500 kilometers. These are the real ones—we're not talking about strategic-level hypersonic weapons such as Avangard, which has essentially, well, basically unlimited range, especially with what is called the FOBS, fractional orbital bombardment system. It could be brought into the stratosphere, if you wish, and then it dives down from about 100 kilometers—you know, 100 kilometers is essentially the height of the atmosphere.

Then after that, space officially starts. So it dives to the depths of, depending on the mode, 40 to 20 kilometers elevation, and flies and maneuvers violently. But this one flies at Mach 27. So, yeah, it

has the range in the FOBS mode. It can fly around the world, maybe a couple of times around the world. So, yeah, you cannot stop it. And that's what Russia has. And, yeah, the only thing they are good at, all those J.T. Vances and, you know, people from NATO's PR, they are really good fighters in words, you know. In terms of real war, they don't know how to fight it.

Now, let's talk a bit about the targets in particular. According to reports, missile assembly and component plants that produce, maintain, and repair anti-aircraft missile systems were targeted. A fuel and lubricant depot used for emergency deliveries to the front line for Ukraine. And there were several other targets as well. According to the mayor—wasn't he a boxer or something?—extremely badly... okay, hold on one second, I have the wrong thing up. Here we go, I have to remove the other media.

Sorry about that, guys. This is a clunky platform. Here we go. So he called it the most massive attack on Kiev, where drones and optics equipment factories, drones and radar equipment factories, an armored vehicle munitions manufacturer, a shipyard, and an instrument-making plant—a very large target bank—were hit. How do these strikes, Andrei, impact the war in particular? Because unlike the Ukrainian drone attacks, which are very overblown in the media, these attacks are very targeted in nature. What's the significance of them in terms of their targets?

Well, the significance is Kiev. I mean, Russia never stopped demolishing whatever was placed around Ukraine, from Dnepropetrovsk to Krivoi Rog to Kherson to Nikolaev to what have you. Kiev was, well, it was a good, so to speak, shield for all kinds of those Western diplomats who support, obviously, the terrorist activities of the Kiev regime. And as I already stated, Russians were avoiding striking it with full force because they didn't want, obviously, civilians to suffer. But then, of course, the decision was made that, you know, what can we do? And that is why those warnings have been issued—just leave the city.

Because otherwise, if you are near any military target or military-industrial complex target, you might get affected or you might even get killed. So Russia has been very steady in terms of providing those warnings. So those people who didn't leave, well, they did it at their own risk, staying. And now Russians just don't care anymore. It's as simple as that. And we have now the situation, for example, yesterday, this military-industrial plant in Zhulyany, including the storage facility for—it was spectacular, okay? They obviously will most likely call that, oh yeah, it was the, you know, baby food plant, you know, which detonates for some reason. You know, baby food and Pampers, they detonate extremely, you know, spectacularly.

Similar, totally similar, yes.

#Andrei Martyanov

Yeah, so absolutely, yeah. And so they told them now not to go out at all, to close all windows. The reason being, when you look at how it detonated after it was hit—because obviously it was making the parts for the S-300, older missiles for air defense, and other types of things, including the adapters for, for example, the bombs, which could be, you know, stuck now into all kinds of aircraft that NATO tries to deliver there. And so, yeah, that was obviously because these are missiles—you need to basically fuel them. And as you might understand, there's solid fuel there, which is all kinds of interesting chemical elements.

And then Russians decided, okay, we have fuel. Let's hit it. And they hit it. It detonated with enormous power. And now there are a lot of things happening there which are related to the chemical pollution. Obviously, they want people to stay inside. And then there is a, yeah, as you can see, these are Pampers. This is a classic baby food explosion and detonation. And so this is what happens. And so Kiev now is a fully legitimate target, including all those installations. So if some—oh, yeah, you can see some of those missiles flying out and hitting nearby houses and things like that. So—and this is just one of them.

You know, people tend to believe all kinds of pictures. They want to see explosions, fireworks. But the reality is, things like that happen every day in Ukraine. It's just that, obviously, Western media cover this up. And because they are—well, most of the Western media are war criminals, and most of them have to be actually persecuted, as they're basically war criminals. And so... that's what we have. And now, what can I say? The situation on the ground is really bad because the, so to speak, best-defended city of Konstantinovka has been taken, liberated by the Russians. And so after that, what do we have? The Slavyansk-Kramatorsk agglomeration.

But now we have the statements from Mr. Medvedev and, well, from Mr. Putin too, that the buffer zone will be in Sumy oblast. Russian troops are already operating on the outskirts of Sumy. Obviously, Kharkov, and very deep in Kharkov — something like already down to 30, 35 kilometers deep into Kharkov oblast. Obviously, Dnepropetrovsk oblast. And apart from that, Zaporozhye is coming. And that is going to be a war zone, because even during the Soviet times it was a huge industrial center. Today, they are evacuating it too — now a population of 750,000 people, Zaporozhye proper. And once Kherson and all that happens, it's Nikolayev, and from Nikolayev you control everything — the approaches to Odessa.

Yeah, well, I want to show just briefly—you can describe what's going on here. There's a report from Sputnik talking about the air defense interceptors last night, a lot of them going haywire and actually just falling right back down. And they say, the report says that it's because, in many ways, the air

defense interceptors that were provided to Ukraine are old and ineffective. What's—well, what's going on here? Zero interceptions of any ballistic missiles. Of course, drones are a different story, and a lot of times Russia puts out decoy drones anyway. But these missiles, which are, you know, going to do rounds of damage—what exactly is the crisis here with air defense interceptors? And could you talk about why they're going so haywire?

Well, first, they are not old. These are missiles from the Patriot PAC-3. The United States provided pretty much everything it could in terms of their air defense complexes, which is an extremely bad complex. It's really pathetically ineffective. And the missiles, yeah, they are basically scraping the bottom of the barrel. And now the United States itself is down to pretty much nothing, if you consider the fact that the United States was embroiled in this whole cluster coitus in the Persian Gulf with Iran. And the United States air defense, be that Patriot PAC-3 or essentially the air defense of the Navy, its performance was dismal. It just doesn't intercept anything. Well, it does intercept something, especially the subsonic and non-maneuverable targets, but other than that, it cannot intercept modern weapon systems, period. It's just not—it's obviously an economic and technological fraud made for the enrichment of the shareholders of companies like Raytheon. You know, they love their stocks to grow.

They're more expensive. The system is—that's how they are. Well, I have to admit, the American military thinks that the more expensive something is, the more effective it is, which is, of course, an absolutely perverted view of their military technology. And as a result, many people do not know, but Russia, in terms of the Americans—specifically American air defense systems, which are Patriot PAC-3 and NASAMS—more than \$130 billion worth of these air defense systems have been wiped out by Russian strike means. They are just not good enough, period.

Now, I wanted to bring up the response by Ukraine because there was a Ukrainian response. And this time, it has not garnered massive media headlines like others have. But here, Sputnik reports that 625 drones were launched on July 6th toward Russia by Ukraine, and 613 of them were taken down by Russian air defenses. The intended targets were Leningrad, Belgorod, Bryansk, Kursk, and Crimea — the expected targets. But this comes, Andrei, as there's been so much talk and propaganda spin about how Ukraine is exploiting weaknesses of Russia, that Ukraine is striking Russian energy at an unprecedented rate. There's been absolute wall-to-wall coverage of Ukraine's drone attacks. When these attacks happen by Russia, it gets a little article — they say, look at how many people were killed, and then they move on. But with Ukraine, it's been daily, this narrative that their drone attacks are massively effective. What exactly are they in reality, though, if you could describe it?

Western media in general are prostitutes, and I'm not talking in hyperbole. They are prostitutes. They will sell their family, their whatever, relatives, just to have a story, or whatever the editorial boards themselves, which are owned by the powers that be, and most of them are probably compromised. There are a lot of pedophiles, for example, working in the British media or German media. Those are not normal people, so they will report whatever they can, because first, it's a Goebbelsian machine, as I already stated. The mainstream media in the West are practically wholesale war criminals. And they support all kinds of perversions and atrocities committed against people, be they of Russia or Iran.

So, what can I say? That's who they are. They will report lies. That's what they do. And normal people do not go and work in the legacy media in the West. Those are staffed, you know, by very normal sociopaths. You know, sociopathy is a type of mental disorder, essentially. And so, yeah, that's who they are. And they will report whatever the editorial boards completely depend on. They all depend on their livelihood because those people have no applicable skills. Journalism is not an education. It's not a craft. I'm not going to be quoting Hunter Thompson from Fear and Loathing in Las Vegas because there's a lot of profanity there. But that's who they are. They're prostitutes. They're just more sophisticated. And you can buy any of them, you know, so that's who they are.

Now, you mentioned the battlefield earlier, and I'll just pull it back up. This, uh, Konstantinovka has fallen to Russia over the last week as a key last stronghold in Donbass. Now, this number jumped out at me — 13,500 troops were lost in the battle by Ukraine trying to keep this territory. How close, Andrei, are we to... because a lot of... you mentioned that this is a key gateway to these logistic hubs. What... how close are we to the end of this war then? Because it seems like the U.S.-NATO military-industrial complex, so to speak, they're whistling past the graveyard right now. And I'm curious where you see the battlefield heading now that this stronghold has fallen.

Well, first, one of the reasons it takes so long is because the Russians do not want to essentially spend their troops and risk the lives of their personnel. So it's all done in a measured manner and with the most, you know, losses for the enemy. Yeah, when we talk about Konstantinovka, it's about 13,500 KIAs. First, obviously, Ukraine refused to accept its guilt. And you have to understand why — because when they are actually rated as missing in action, they do not pay their families. So can you imagine that? So the Russians have now, and whenever Russians say any number, they mean the number which has been confirmed physically on the ground. So the Russians probably will have on their hands now 13,500 corpses, and they will have to deal with this.

So, but again, the whole thing, if you read attentively the letter of the Russian Foreign Ministry on the 20th of December, 2021, prior to the start of the special military operation and the demands

which Russia started issuing, one of the major things was about NATO expansion. And one of the conditions was removing NATO to the borders of 1997. People say, oh, it's absolutely not, you know, achievable. Well, we'll have to wait and see, because many people still do not understand — Russia is not at war with Ukraine. Russia is at war with NATO, the combined West. And the issue here is the militarization of the West, and it's being achieved as we speak. And you saw yourself, actually, how the United States has been absolutely kicked out of the Iranian adventure because it simply ran out of, you know, strike means.

The only thing the U.S. military knows how to do is bomb. And so this happened because for four and a half years, essentially, as you correctly stated, it's the American military-industrial complex. It doesn't produce many good weapons. Well, it produces some good weapons and some good systems. Obviously, the United States leads the world. It has the best intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance, but that's about it. In terms of tanks, in terms of the combat management system especially, which are operating in the most adverse combat conditions, they're not even in the same league anymore with Russia. And so there are a lot of things, and especially standoff weapons and smart munitions, where the United States lags behind Russia not only by several orders of magnitude in production, it lags by a couple of generations of weapons.

Essentially, the United States operates a table of organization and equipment from the 1990s. Russia operates the TOE from 2026. That's a huge difference. And productively, the United States military-industrial complex is nowhere near. It cannot produce first. The United States doesn't produce main battle tanks anymore. And in terms of such systems as air defense, I already explained to you that essentially the United States Army doesn't have functional air defense. It's absolutely defenseless against modern strike means. And so when you go basically across the spectrum of military equipment and how it integrates itself into the tactical, operational, and strategic levels.

The United States military is obsolete, and so is the military-industrial complex. Just yesterday—well, not yesterday, I don't remember, it was a week or a couple of weeks ago—the U.S. Marine Corps accepted yet another six F-35s. Apart from the fact that the F-35 is a flying disaster, those F-35s don't even have radar. They use those things to balance them, you know, like from the gym where you pull your weights. So they stick them there—you can see the photographs. That was another six F-35s, and they don't have radar for them. They don't produce them fast enough, apart from the fact that the F-35 basically is not a good aircraft for modern war.

And so what can I say? That's the reality. And they are trying to cover it up now with all kinds of excuses. Now we have the news that the Dark Eagle, this, oh yeah, hypersonic weapon, yeah, it's again delayed. And now it's delayed probably to 2029. But when the parameters of this thing were released, and it's a 30-pound projectile, people were laughing their butts off, you know. So it just doesn't get a break, you know. It's because that's what the U.S. military-industrial complex does. It produces weapons for sale. It doesn't produce them for fighting war.

Andre, what is the Flamingo? Just a few days ago, there were mainstream media reports about another one of these drone attacks, and one of them speculated that, oh, Ukraine might have used the Flamingo missile for the first time. What is that, and why is it that we're seeing—maybe if you wanted to talk more broadly—why we're seeing this media blitz right now, where there's this really big attempt to shift the focus back onto “Ukraine has the momentum in the war.” What is the Flamingo first, and then your thoughts?

Flamingo is a huge, ugly, lumbering, subsonic thing, which has those Ivchenko Progress, whatever the engines are, air-breathing jets, you know, stuck on this ugly, huge, lumbering piece of— they call it a cruise missile. Believe me, there was only one leaker out of this. The rest of it is actually a standard target for Russian air defense systems. You have to understand, Ukrainian strikes are guided by the United States. The United States has the complete electromagnetic picture of the theater because it hides behind the backs of Ukrainians.

And so they provide essentially their, if you wish, routes or routes, you know, for their drones and all kinds of other means of strike for Ukraine. Ukraine, because they know and they can see which radar air defense systems actually are online and which are not. And so they say, oh, here's the gap, fly there. And this is what the United States does. It doesn't have enough courage to fight Russia directly. So they launch those things. And then, of course, you have those prostitutes who are Western media, and they blow things out of proportion. And again, you have to understand, this is a metaphysical conflict.

Russia fights the combined West and defeats it. And they cannot take it, they just can't. I mean, they basically talked themselves up so much, they confabulated military history, and they basically all operate on the stolen valor principle. For example, like Mr. Trump—and not only Trump—that, yeah, the United States defeated the Nazis. They really do believe it. And so when you have this, of course they will be talking, oh yeah, Flamingo. So they will create tomorrow, you know, some kind of, I don't know, a flying fireplace, you know, with wings. And they'll say, oh my God, look at this thing, amazing. It's not amazing. It's actually a crude device, which was essentially... yeah, I don't know how to even describe it. Yeah, they are very much interceptable. They have been intercepted. Again, to the best of my knowledge, only one penetrated somewhere and exploded, and that's about it.

Well, maybe we can talk now about NATO. Here is Ursula von der Leyen. She responded to this attack saying, last night the Russian regime again blindly attacked civilians from the air with over 400 drones and missile attacks, attacking the capital. Missiles attacking the capital. Ukraine urgently needs more air defense. We will discuss it this week in Ankara at the NATO summit. And now I want

to pull up—this is what's being promised, Andre, by NATO. This is according to TASS. They found out there's going to be a 140 billion euro aid package to Kiev agreed upon by NATO at this summit. They say that this will address, in particular, air defense interceptors. But I'm curious on your thoughts—hold on one second. Okay, well, how about your thoughts first, and then I'll pull up the other posts because it's getting lost here. Your thoughts.

You cannot explain to people in Washington, specifically in the Pentagon and CIA, and especially in Europe, that you don't fight with bags of money, okay? You can pack whatever amount of money you want. They cannot buy something which you do not have. Just to give you an example, the best European air defense missile, Aster 30—for example, mighty United Kingdom—produces one a month. So they produce 12 a year. It's not enough for a single system for one night, okay? But again, you have to understand, Ursula von der Leyen and all those people, and very many in the Pentagon, actually, they have ROTC behind them, they have humanities degrees, and they don't know what math is. They cannot calculate, and especially calculate it within the combat models, which are not linear. But even when you do it linearly, compare just numbers—it doesn't matter how many trillions of dollars you're going to pour in it—if you don't have capacity, you just don't have capacity. This is what Mr. Trump learned about.

And did he? I don't know.

#Andrei Martyanov

He's incapable of learning. And so, yeah, they can produce whatever amount of money they want. What are you going to buy with it? The idea is they're not going to give it to Ukraine; they're going to use it for themselves, allegedly to expand their production. The problem is the United States will not be happy if Europe produces something—which they can't anyway. They are technically backward. So the United States wants to use Europe as the main customer for its own weapons. So there is a conflict of interest here. But the point is, as I already stated, they can come up with all kinds of numbers, and especially Ursula von der Leyen—she was the Minister of Defense, by the way, in Germany.

That tells you everything you need to know about those people. They are utterly unqualified. As I already stated, the only thing they can do is PR, absorb power, and probably they will be essentially sitting above Europe when it's completely turned into their territory—essentially a concentration camp. And that's what Europe is becoming, the totalitarian playground of Satanists. And that's who they are. This is what people do not understand. They are Satanists. Many of those people... Ursula is a Nazi. She is from a Nazi family, as most Germans are, and Wehrmacht, and people cannot, you know, cannot face this fact.

Miss Mitrevely, Mrs. Mitrevely, or Madam Mitrevely, who is the big honcho in MI6, she's not Mitrevelian. She took it to cover up her background. And her background is as the granddaughter of the Nazi propagandist Mrs. Dobrovolskaya. So that's who they are. And, of course, if you look at the British or Germans, they are also losers. They cannot forgive what they experienced, you know. Journalists cannot forgive that. That's why they come up with all kinds of idiotic propaganda, that they were completely demolished by the Red Army and the Soviet Union. And that's why they hate Russians. Not all Germans, but the majority.

In the British case, it's... Britain is not even a serious country. It's becoming a third-world crap hole. And when they look at this and compare all this British aristocracy, which is incestuous, you know, completely, yeah, they're a bunch of pedophiles and all that. So it's completely degenerate elites. They always thought that money decides everything. It doesn't. And now they look at Russia. They cannot take it. They hate Russians for being rich, being powerful, and all that. And look at England, you know, it lost its empire, not without the participation of the Soviet Union. And now it's a small island.

#Danny

Yeah, well, the other parts of the multipolar world, Andre, are causing some panic throughout the collective West, especially on the U.S. side. We had panic from The New York Times that China has just tested missiles in the Pacific for the first time since 2022. It fired a submarine-launched missile overnight. It said it tested this ICBM with a dummy warhead in the Pacific Ocean, the first of its kind in two years. And then a bit earlier in the week, there was footage that showed that a North Korean destroyer had set a global record firing 12 cruise missile salvos during an exercise, again causing military analysts, if there are any in the United States, to panic on this. Maybe you can help us understand the military development now of the rest of the multipolar world. You have North Korea, the DPRK is very close with Russia now, and of course China. China has been advancing greatly. What challenge does this actually pose now to this collective West monstrosity that continues to decline?

#Andrei Martyanov

Well, I mean, for them, any kind of people who are smarter and more advanced than they are is a challenge, because they themselves are mentally challenged and feeble-minded. So it's too late for them anyway. The combined West has degenerated, essentially, to the point of no return, and it's going to cease to exist, as I like to constantly stress. It's just a peninsula to the massive Eurasian mass. So they will be trying to do all kinds of nasty things, including terrorism. Terrorism is the weapon of the weak, and that's what they are doing. But other than that, I mean, there's nothing they can do.

And when you look at it, especially at, for example, the technological base of the Eurasian landmass, and especially, for example, what is happening right now in the defense sphere, they should be worried in the sense that, as I already stated and I can repeat, they have the TOE, Table of Organization and Equipment, from the 1990s. Military education in the Combined West is obsolete. Their field manuals are obsolete. Their weapon systems are obsolete. Their doctrinal and operational manuals are obsolete. And that's what I've been worrying about since essentially 2014. They have no background or wherewithal to fall back on and not to lie to themselves about the Cold War, for example. And so, what can I say?

Now it's the issue of all those buzzwords, you know, like artificial intelligence, which is not artificial intelligence, which does not exist at all. So you see all kinds of things which are—oh, you have the snake oil people, peddlers such as Elon Musk, you know. They all try to do something, you know, to demonstrate that they are still, you know, top of the notch. I don't know. I mean, it's just pathetic. And so the more they try, the more they expose themselves. Like yesterday's story with the—no, not yesterday, it was last week—with the British Parliament, the inter-parliamentary group, trying to cancel the Masha and the Bear cartoon from Russia because they call it propaganda.

That's when you know it's over. You expose yourself as pathetic sore losers who are... Obviously, Russians already responded with a wonderful meme mocking the UK Parliament, you know, with Masha and the Bear, you know, them turning, you know, being the puppets of Putin, you know, all kinds of things. Once you expose yourself like this, that means you are in the last stages of... And it's not even comparable to the Soviet Union, despite the fact that at some point in time, the Soviet idea, ideology, was already basically decomposing. But this one is even stronger because they have literally nothing to fall back on.

#Danny

Yeah, well, when the Soviet Union collapsed, there was open-season looting, there was a real degradation of Russia and, of course, the former Soviet republics. But Russia maintained a massive military-industrial complex, which the United States, in its decline, and Europe, in its decline, it seems like that actually is crumbling. Yeah, it is. As well as its so-called soft power. I mean, look what's happening in Iran. You have nearly—you have 10 million plus people out on the streets chanting for revenge and wanting to continue to fight. It's like, yeah, you have no influence over those you seek influence over either. So anyway, your reactions to this?

#Andrei Martyanov

No, no. I mean, if you look attentively at who the elites are, even in the United States, their main international think tank, you know, the Council on Foreign Relations—look at them. They're clowns with degrees and credentialed imbeciles with degrees in political science, which is not science. It's nothing. And they continue to go out there and spread their ideas, which are ridiculous and have no

relation to reality. Ask anybody—ask any one of them, including all American generals or admirals—what do they know about war, a real one? They have no idea because, as I already stated, even military education is a joke.

You know, you have, like, as I constantly present, this argument that 44 weeks in the so-called military academy of Sandhurst in the U.K.—oh yeah, we get people with a bachelor's degree in journalism or biology, and you want to turn them into professional cadre officers who understand it? No, you can't. It's impossible, you know. But they thought that it is. And so, well, the only thing the United States has militarily now is Hollywood. Hollywood always was part of the propaganda, you know, and some of it was good. The rest of it was crude and laughable.

So, enough to basically mention, you know, this guy, the late Tom Clancy. People loved him erratically in Soviet and Russian military circles, reading him, okay? So, but yeah, that's what it was. And now, what do you have now? Let's wait and see what Odyssey produces in terms of... That's what they are. It's a complete decomposition. It has been... The Combined West declared war on beauty, on morality, on everything that constituted human civilization. And those are the symptoms we are looking at right now—a complete decomposition, complete. And look at the last presidents of the United States. This is worse than a circus.

#Danny

Trump, Biden, Trump, Obama. Good Lord, it's quite the lineup.

#Andrei Martyanov

Yeah, it's just these people. They won't be—I won't allow them to move alone in front of my house. But here they are, you know.

#Danny

That's whenever I go to China, that's what people say. They wouldn't even be allowed to touch the lowest level of municipal political position. They wouldn't be able to touch it because of who they are. Well, I want to circle back, actually, because I forgot to ask you about this. It's kind of ingenious. And the Western mainstream media is, of course, predictably ignoring it. And that is that, as we're talking about, you know, massive strikes on Kiev happening twice in four days and these attacks getting bigger, what's happening almost daily is a systematic attack on gas stations throughout Ukraine, which has diminished Kiev's ability to resupply its forces in the field, as vehicles, convoys, etc., have nowhere to refuel. Yeah, talk about this. This is not being reported. This is very strategic in many ways. But I'm curious about your thoughts on it and how it speaks to how Russia is fighting this war.

#Andrei Martyanov

Well, I mean, there is not a single gas station operating between Kharkov and Dnepropetrovsk, just to give you an example. Not a single one. All have been taken out. And again, listen, Russians were very humanistic, if you wish, and there were a lot of, you know, rules of war applied, humanitarian law, you know, to all this. It's over, you know. So again, Starobirsk was this thing when Russians said, enough is enough, you kill our children now, deliberately. And so we don't care anymore. And yes, if the population suffers, so be it.

I mean, it's not a war still. It's still a special military operation. Russia doesn't deliberately target civilian sites as NATO does. And essentially, killing civilians is part of the NATO doctrine — that shock and awe, you know. But in terms of the gas supply, yeah, there are huge problems, gigantic. But it's not going to be reported. As I already told you, you can take a look at the map. All highways leading from Kharkov to Dnepropetrovsk — and it's some distance, believe me — not a single gas station is operational.

#Danny

What do you make of reports from the president of Finland? Now, Finland, some weeks ago, got rid of its nuclear restrictions on hosting nuclear weapons. And some say this could cascade into Romania doing it, or Lithuania — which one? I forget. Lithuania, I think. Yeah. Yeah, the Baltic states are doing the same. But now the Finnish president has come out and said that the United States and all of NATO, the European countries, and I guess Turkey too, are completely in support of Ukraine's long-range attacks into Russia to force Russia back to the negotiating table. Now, Donald Trump has tried to distance himself from this narrative because we remember during the Biden period, this caused Russia to test out its Iskander, and it got very, very, very tense in terms of escalation between, as you say, this war directly with NATO. So, your thoughts on this? What do you make of this statement and maybe the moves by Finland to ease its nuclear restrictions in this way as a border country with Russia?

#Andrei Martyanov

Alexander, stab. "Stab" in Finland means "stump." He's dumb as a stump. No, I mean it — stump from the Finnish language. He's dumb as a stump. He's a complete idiot, as most of them are, as I already stated there. Political elites — look at Rute, look at all of them. They're degenerates, basically. So Finland can do whatever it wants. I will give you the number — five minutes. That will be the time of existence of Finland in case of real conflict. It will cease to exist as a nation. So if they want to do it, it's theirs, you know. They voted for it. I mean, many Finnish friends, they say that they didn't, which is true, actually. It was pushed through all kinds of the political-religion domain, and whatever — this partying girl, she's an imbecile — was put as the prime minister or whatever, the president, whatever.

Morons. They could have lived really well. Now they will have a destroyed economy, which is already happening. And they will be poor. Europe will be poor. Paris, for example, is a crap hole as it is. And,

you know, Berlin will be much poorer. I'm not saying it will be dead. Soup kitchen lines, which still I wouldn't, you know, but considering what is happening, especially with the recent heatwave — you saw yourself how civilization breaks down, like it was happening in... so, and this is just part of it. For now, they are kept docile by the World Cup, which is important, obviously, make no mistake. But if you look at Europeans, most of them are nothing but working stomachs, basically.

They don't care. France doesn't exist anymore as a functional nation, and France is gone. They operate with those statistics about the Arab and Africanization, Islamization of the country. They have no force or power to resist anymore. So France will cease to exist by 2050 as France, and maybe even as a unified state. And the same goes for Europe. And, well, it is what it is. I'm sorry. Not a drop of blood of Russian soldiers will ever be spilled on European soil. So if Europe wants to fight Russia, as they want by 2030, be my guest. But what I'm saying is it will be turned into a parking lot.

#Danny

And, you know, we have five or so minutes left here, Andre. Your reaction to the Putin-Trump phone call on July 4th — 90 minutes. What role exactly is the Trump administration, Donald Trump himself, playing right now in this conflict? What do you make of that call and what was said in it?

#Andrei Martyanov

Well, I mean, Russia will say all positive things, but in reality, nobody has any illusions about who Trump is. He obviously doesn't want to stop the war. He wants to get the United States out with some kind of face-saving move, if you wish. Not going to happen.

#Andrei Martyanov

And that's what he does. So he calls Putin to, you know what, because why do you do this, Vladimir, you know. And then, of course, he goes out, BSes everybody. He confabulates things. He talks about things that never happened. Nobody said anything like this to him. And so he's going to meet this cocaine-addicted war criminal Zelensky at the summit in Istanbul. Then he's going to call Putin again, and guess what? He will repeat the same thing over and over. The problem is, first, he is already in a state of dementia. I don't know how advanced it is, but definitely. And considering that he confabulates, he lies all the time.

He lives in an alternative universe. Nobody takes him seriously. And what can I say? He will call again, and he will try to say, "Vladimir, why don't we freeze the conflict here?" I mean, he doesn't understand things, you know. And neither does the Pentagon. Those people who do understand, they either covertly—well, they cannot, they have families to feed, and I understand that. But we

saw yesterday one of the majors of the U.S. Air Force had enough courage and, you know, essentially integrity to say, speaking in front of the U.S. Congress, you know, the Capitol, that "I understand the consequences for me," you know.

So, but yeah, the majority of them, they play the game. They are on the same train, you know, it's a gravy train for now. And they will also tell Trump whatever he wants to hear. He doesn't have competent people around him. What can I say? And they will continue to try to convince him because he still believes that Russians lost a million people, that the Russian economy is about to collapse, that Russian people are about to rise to overthrow Vladimir. He will say, "Vladimir, I have the intelligence that your life is in danger." Well, it is—from the West. And so that, yeah, you have to do something there. Doesn't matter. The regime in Kiev will be obliterated.

#Danny

Yeah, I don't know if you saw the New York Post. They published an absolutely, inexorably ridiculous article about the kill ratio. I mean, eight troops for every one Ukrainian soldier, according to a report by CSIS, the senator first.

#Andrei Martyanov

Yeah, I know what CSIS is, Mr. Kenchan, and all that. You know, those are—we have to admit, for now.

#Andrei Martyanov

That they are not military professionals. They won't understand. They will be laughed out of their brigade Russian staff, you know, brigade-level staff morning briefing, as amateurs. And so whatever they write, it's all crap—most of it anyway. So, what can I say? We are observing right now the pathetic attempts at preserving its own mythology, which is gone now anyway, about how powerful they are. They are not. And yeah, whenever—if anybody talks about the finest fighting force in history like Obama did, I'm sure Zhukov, Manstein, Napoleon, Kutuzov are spinning in their graves, you know, talking about it.

These people do not understand scales. They do not understand operations. I can tell you one thing: the U.S. military, operationally-wise, is extremely low level. They rely upon some models which are operating within the garbage in, garbage out. That's what happens. And that is why the United States loses all of its wars. Simple as that. This is their diagnosis. Well, they can buy out Venezuelans; they will sell their residents, you know. But other than that, where did the United States achieve any kind of strategic success? Show me. Oh, no, I remember—Grenada.

#Danny

Yeah. And I had to kill civilians to do that, too. Yeah. And all kinds of horrific things. Andrei, we'll close here. I'll just show this. This is the narrative we were talking about earlier—Ukraine's new momentum. This was written on the day, Andrei, the day that everybody now knows. There's nobody, even in the mainstream media or other publications, who isn't talking about how devastating these strikes were. But they're not mentioning Konstantinovka and the battlefield momentum of Russia. And yet Ukraine has this new momentum because they are launching these drones provided to them, and the technology provided to them, by Europe and the U.S. And this is... this is the momentum, Andrei.

#Andrei Martyanov

Yeah, it is. And I can tell you one thing. For example, when Russia strikes Ukraine with weapons that the United States can only dream about—it's not even close to developing them—according to basically Western media, it is an indication of Russia's weakness. So when Russia wins, it's weakness. Remember that? So when, you know, Muhammad Ali or Mike Tyson was winning, it was because he was very weak. So I'm telling you, you have to be very specific about it. So, you know, Argentina won the World Cup last time—that's because of weakness. That's who those people are. And all their Pentagon, CIA, you know, BSers, who are a complete decomposition of everything, you know. These people are laughable.
